The Lords Supper

The Lord's Supper, or Holy Communion, is central to our lives. It is celebrated each first day of the week by every member of the Plymouth Brethren and it serves to hold our community together in the bond of Christian fellowship and in committal to the Lord Jesus Christ. This simple and private service follows the form given in 1 Corinthians 11:23-28, John 20:19, Acts 20:7 and other Scriptures. It is keenly attended by all our households, and we include our children who receive the sacraments on the basis of the words of Jesus: "Take eat, this is my body" Matthew 26:26-28. Attendance at the Lords Supper is key to membership

Marriage

The sanctity of the marriage bond is regarded at the highest level. It has been instituted in paradise and confirmed by the Lord Himself when here below. It is doubtless the providential bond of all moral order in the world and meant to be representative in type of Christs relationship with His Assembly (Eph5:25-26, Genesis 2:21-24, Mathew19: 4-6).

The marriage ceremony is conducted in conformity to Danish law.
